

The Protocols Permission to enter the Kingdom of Thailand for non-Thai nationals

The Protocols Permission to enter the Kingdom for non-Thai nationals who meet the criteria under section 3 (5) of the Regulation Issued under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (2005) (No. 1)

As approved in the meeting No. 3/2563 of the Operation Centre for Measures on the Entry into and Departure from the Kingdom, as follows:

- 1) Permission to enter the Kingdom for non-Thai nationals who meet the criteria under section 3 (5) of the Regulation (No. 1) where “**non-Thai nationals who have work permits or have been granted permission from government agencies to work in the Kingdom**” include:
 - 1.1 Aliens who have a work permit
 - 1.2 Aliens who have permission to work from the Ministry of Labour and a copy of an application for a work permit on behalf of an alien (Form WP.3) and aliens who have been granted permission to work in the Kingdom under the Investment Promotion law, the Petroleum law, or other laws under section 62 of the Royal Ordinance on the Management of Foreign Workers Employment B.E. 2560 (2017), who have a certification letter from related agencies.
- 2) Non-Thai nationals who meet the criteria under section 3 (5) of the Regulation **must register through the Royal Thai Embassy or the Royal Thai Consulate in the country of origin** to apply for a certificate of entry into the Kingdom by agreeing to be quarantined in a State facility for 14 days and must present the following documents:
 - 2.1 **A Fit to Fly Health Certificate** which has been certified or issued no more than 72 hours before traveling;
 - 2.2 **Proof of health insurance** with a minimum medical coverage of US \$100,000.

Upon entry into the Kingdom, they must also undergo public health screening measures, and may be required to get a rapid test if deemed necessary, prior to **being quarantined in an alternative state quarantine facility for 14 days**, for which the traveler will be entirely responsible for the expense. These guidelines have already been approved by the Prime Minister, as the Director of the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA)
