**Order of the Centre for the Administration of the Situation
due to the Outbreak of the Communicable Disease Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19)**

No. 4/2564

Re : Guidelines based on Regulations issued under Section 9
of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (2005)
(No. 9)

Pursuant to the Resolution of the Council of Ministers adopted on 30 March B.E. 2564 (2021) extending the duration of the enforcement of the Declaration of an Emergency Situation in all areas of the Kingdom of Thailand as from 1 April B.E. 2564 (2021) until 31 May B.E. 2564 (2021);

In order to perform tasks under the Regulations issued under Section 9 of the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (2005), under the Declaration of an Emergency Situation and the extension of its duration, and under the Order of the Prime Minister No. 5/2563 on the Establishment of a Special Task Force to Perform Duties in Accordance with the Emergency Decree on Public Administration in Emergency Situations B.E. 2548 (2005), issued on 25 March B.E. 2563 (2020), and its amendments, in an efficient manner, by virtue of Clause 4 (2) of the Order of the Prime Minister No. 4/2563 on the Appointment of Supervisors, Chief Officials and Competent Officials Responsible for Remediating the Emergency Situation, issued on 25 March B.E. 2563 (2020), and its amendments, the Prime Minister, in the capacity of the Director of the Centre for COVID-19 Situation Administration, hereby orders Chief Officials responsible for remediating the emergency situation and competent officials to strictly carry out functions in accordance with the disease prevention measures annexed to this Order.

This Order shall come into effect as from 1 April B.E. 2564 (2021) until otherwise ordered.

Definitions:

Organizational Quarantine (OQ) Type A means a quarantine facility designated by the government. It is a specific model of the organization that can arrange a single accommodation equipped with essential things for daily life and support as an individual. There is no group gathering for any activity.

Organizational Quarantine (OQ) Type B means a quarantine facility designated by the government. It is a specific model of the organization that is arranged in a property or permanent building. People can live in a group as staying in the same bedroom and sharing a common space, such as a toilet, a bathroom, a working room, etc. It can be a single accommodation style, but with a group to do any activity together.

Organizational Quarantine (OQ) Type C means a quarantine facility designated by the government. It is a specific model of the organization that is arranged in a temporary structural area. People can live in a group as staying in the same bedroom and sharing a common space, such as a toilet, a bathroom, a kitchen room, a working room, etc.

Note:

1. Travellers should be encouraged to use insurance by companies registered in Thailand under supervision and certification from the Office of the Insurance Commission. The insurance must cover health care and medical expenses for the asymptomatic cases of COVID-19 infection as well.
2. For a person with an exemption or a case under (2), the Prime Minister or the head of the person responsible for resolving an emergency situation may prescribe specific measures as appropriate, in addition to those specified in the schedule.
3. An individual or group of persons under (11.1), the Ministry of Public Health may prescribe specific measures as appropriate, in addition to those specified in the schedule.

4. The travelers will be isolated if they are screened by the communicable disease control officers and found respiratory symptoms or fever including a confirmed result of the COVID 19 test by RT-PCR. The isolation will proceed when the traveler has respiratory symptoms or fever during quarantine or detention. The individual will be transferred to a government-designated medical facility.

5. Counting the quarantine period: when a person enters the Kingdom (starting at the relevant government agency at the international point of entry)

5.1 From 0.01 o'clock to 18.00 o'clock, the date of entry into the Kingdom shall be counted as the first day of quarantine (Day 1).

5.2 From 18.01 to 00.00, the day following the date of entry into the Kingdom shall be counted as the first day of quarantine (Day 1).
