3. Thailand Precautions

- The Prime Minister visited the local areas to inspect the readiness of screening measures for COVID-19 to receive foreign tourists at Samui International Airport, Suratthani province and Phuket International Airport. He emphasized the policy to the Ministry of Public Health and all relevant agencies to strengthen the readiness to accommodate foreign tourists in Koh Samui of Suratthani province and Phuket province. All strict measures including screening by body temperature measurement, laboratory testings, tracking applications and hotels for Alternative Local Quarantine (ALQ) must be fully ready. Furthermore, personnel, drugs and medical supplies are adequately prepared for the operations.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

For risk assessment on November 2, 2020, there had been an increasing number of confirmed COVID-19 infected persons found in Thailand. Almost all of them were Thais and foreigners travelled from overseas and were detected at the State Quarantine and Alternative Quarantine facilities. Moreover, countries around the world continue to have more infected people and some have had the second wave of the pandemic. Therefore, it is likely that there will be more infected persons coming from abroad. Nevertheless, the current situation in Thailand is well under control.
