### 3. Thailand Precautions

- The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Public Health, gave a press interview after being Chair of the Center for COVID-19 Situation Medical and Public Health Emergency Administration (CCS-MPHA) meeting that the meeting has approved the proposal to the CCSA to decrease the quarantine period from 14 to 10 days for countries with equal or a little more risk compared to Thailand. For high risk countries, the quarantine will remain at 14 days. The measure makes it easier to attract tourists to travel to Thailand. This is based on the scientific evidence that the quarantine period of 10 and 14 days will sufficiently cover the incubation period of the disease.

## 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

The number of new cases remained stable compared to the 1st week of this month (November 2020). All infected persons found on November 6, 2020 showed no symptoms. However, screening method and symptom enquiry performance at the State Quarantine facilities should be re-evaluated whether there have been any modification or management to increase the accuracy of disease detection.
