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3. Thailand Precautions

Roi Et Provincial Public Health Office emphasized that people should follow measures to protect themselves from COVID -19 as follows: 1) avoid going to crowded places, 2) always wear masks when going out, 3) If feel sick , i.e. have fever, coughing, sneezing, wear a medical mask, 4) wash hands often with water and soap for at least 20 seconds or use alcohol gel, especially when being in the public and before eating, and 5) scan the application "Thai Chana" before entry and exit of the public places to be information used for effective contact tracing and outbreak control..

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

The COVID-19 confirmed cases during the past 3 months in Thailand were found among the people coming from abroad. Eighty-five percent of the confirmed cases had no symptoms on the date of detection. In addition, most of them were detected within 10 days after arrival. Therefore, continuous surveillance with a focus on laboratory screening rather than the symptomatic screening should be carried out. Strict quarantine measures must be followed including the prohibition that those even without any symptom must not meet with other people.
