### 3. Thailand Precautions

- The Public Relations Department, Office of the Prime Minister, has informed that His Majesty King Maha Vajiralongkorn Bodindradebayavarangkun and Her Majesty Queen Suthida Bajrasudhabimalalakshana have provided respirators and medical devices to 123 hospitals in all 77 provinces. The hospitals include those under the Ministry of Defense and the Royal Thai Police, the Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA), the Ministry of Public Health and the Medical Schools. The royal provision is under the royal respirators and medical devices project for coping with the Covid-19 situation.
- Office of the Election Commission of Thailand has established COVID-19 prevention and control measures for the election of Chief Executive of the Provincial Administrative Organization (PAO) on 20 December 2020. The measures include reducing the number of people per polling station to reduce congestion, social distancing, temperature check by village health volunteers and encourage people to wear a mask all the time.
- Chiang Rai province organized a Big Cleaning Day activity under the code 10101220 (the activity started at 10.00 am on 10 December 2020) with cooperation from all sectors to clean all the 18 districts and providing SAR-CoV-2 testing service SAR-CoV-2 testing service by a Biosafety Mobile Unit in front of the City Hall.

### 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the situation monitoring of the COVID-19 around the world, it was found that the total number of COVID-19 cases was 69.2 million, and the number of deaths was 1.57 million (2.38% Case Fatality Rate, CFR). The COVID-19 pandemic tends to continue spreading in many regions. So, travelers returning from abroad still have the risk of COVID-19 spreading into Thailand. Therefore, those who have intention to come to Thailand are requested to follow the disease control measures including the state quarantine regime, and avoid illegal traveling through natural border paths that can create the risk of disease spreading.
