### 3. Thailand Implementations

- The Ministry of Public Health and Ministry of Interior signed the Memorandum of Understanding on the project "integrated COVID-19 vaccine immunization in the community to take care of all the people throughout the country". The project also encouraged all target groups in 1,120 communities of every sub-district to receive the vaccine. This will help support the people's mental health at individual, family and community levels to strongly face and get through the COVID-19 pandemic situation.
- The Ministry of Public Health had driven the "New Normal Good Health" policy through the "Safe Chinese New Year, Getting Away from COVID 19" measure. The ministry advised people to use online ordering instead to avoid crowded fresh markets or supermarkets. The online ordering is convenient, helps save travel expenses and possibly a lower price and reduces the risk of Coronavirus 2019 infection.
- Tak province issued an order to close places and prohibit entering - exiting the An-Sor Mosque community area in Mae Sot subdistrict, Mae Sot district, Tak province, by 1) close the whole Benjarak-Karnbunchee alley, 2) close the Kheng-Sin

mill alley, 3) close the Tang-Kim-Chiang warehouse alley, 4) close the intersection alley on the side of the Mae-Sot-Borikarn gas station, and 5) close the alley in front of the Molly Café during 11 to 17 February from 24.00 p.m. unless there is a necessary cause that get permission from the Communicable Disease Control Officer.

#### 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

According to the global COVID-19 pandemic situation, there have been more than 107 million accumulated patients. Currently, the number of cases has decreased to less than 5 hundred thousand patients per day. The number of deaths remains stable in the range of 10,000 to 15,000 cases per day. The accumulated deaths have been more than 2.3 millions. Most of the new cases have been found in the USA, Brazil, France, Spain, Russia and the UK. In Thailand, the number of community infected cases has been declining to less than 100 cases per day. Last week, the intensive active case finding had detected hundreds of asymptomatic cases per day, especially in Samut Sakhon province. This week, the number of infected cases from active case finding has been decreased to less than 150 cases per day. However this week, new cases have still been found in Bangkok and its vicinity, including the province nearby Samut Sakhon province. Today, a cluster of new cases has been found in Mae Sot district, Tak province. This indicates that there has still been a low level of the disease spreading in the central and the western regions in the central and western regions including inter-country cross border areas. Therefore, people are requested for collaboration on self-protection and reduction of the disease spreading risk. They are advised to wear masks, wash hands frequently, avoid unnecessary travel especially to risk crowded places and scan “ ThaiChana” application or use “ MorChana application when traveling to places. In case of developing symptoms including coughing, sore throat, runny nose or loss of smell and taste, people are recommended to visit hospitals immediately and inform the doctors of their travelling history as much as possible.
