#### 3. Thailand Implementations

- The Ministry of Public Health (MOPH) held a signing ceremony of the Memorandum of Understanding on the Storage, Packaging and Distribution of COVID-19 Vaccine between the Government Pharmaceutical Organization and DKSH Co., Ltd., the company which will operate the collection of 2 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines from the Sinovac Company and distribute them to hospitals in target areas without charges. The details of the administration of said vaccines will be announced on February 22, 2021.
- Bangkok: The 1/2021 Meeting of the Sub-Committee for the Management of Vaccination against Coronavirus Disease 2019, approved to provide the first vaccine service to the 6 districts that adjacent to Samut Sakhon province, which are Bang Khun Thian, Bang Bon, Nong Khaem, Jomthong, Bang Khae, and Phasi Charoen.

The hospitals that are ready to provide vaccination services in this first phase include Bang Khun Thian Geriatric hospital, Luang Por Thaweesak Chutinatharo Uthit hospital, and Ratchaphiphat hospital.

#### 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the surveillance system of COVID-19 outbreak on 19 February 2021 found that there are a total number of 25,241 confirmed and total 22,562 new infected cases in Thailand. It includes 130 new cases and 1 death. By a new outbreak as of December 15, 2020, 21,004 confirmed cases have been cumulative, 23 cumulative deaths, representing 0.11% morbidity rate. Therefore, people are requested to cooperate in the implementation of disease prevention measures. These measures include wearing a mask, frequently washing hands, and reducing unessential travel especially in crowded places. Therefore, people are requested to cooperate in the implementation of disease prevention measures which are wearing a mask, frequently washing hands, and reducing unessential travel especially in crowded places. They are also requested to scan "Thai Chana" or "Mor Chana" applications when traveling to other places and observe their own symptoms for 14 days after visiting any high-risk areas. Anyone who visited markets that have been reported infected cases and developed a fever, caught, sore throat, running nose or loss of smell and taste, they are recommended to visit hospitals immediately and inform the doctors of their real travelling history as much as possible
