3. Thailand Implementations

- Trat Province resolved to cancel the Ban Tha Park screening point starting midnight on February 23, 2021. In addition, Trat province has jointly considered the draft order to appoint a subcommittee to the Executive Committee for the vaccination against COVID-19.
- The Center for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) approved to operate the Thai League Football Tournament from January to April 2021 while limiting the seating capacity to 50%. The green light was given for other sports and beauty contests including the Thailand League Volleyball Tournament from February to April 2021 (which can operate at 30% capacity), local and international cycling tournaments from February to November 2021 (its capacity limits for sports fans will be identified by the Provincial Communicable Diseases Committee), the Miss Grand



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International Beauty Pageant in March 2021 (limiting the seating capacity to 30%), the Jet Ski World Cup and Pro Tour in April, 2021 in Pattaya City (limiting the seating capacity to 50%) and the LPGA Golf Tournament in Chon Buri province in which the Provincial Communicable Diseases Committee will prescribe the spectator capacity.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the COVID-19 outbreak situation in the past week, the number of infections has decreased. Most of the cases have been found by active case finding in high-risk places such as communities, markets and establishments. The five provinces with the highest numbers of cases are Samut Sakhon, Pathumthani, Bangkok, Nakhon Pathom, and Chonburi. However, new infections have decreased in some provinces such as Samut Sakhon, Samutprakarn and Bangkok. Some provinces need to monitor the situation closely due to the increasing trend of new cases in their communities including Pathumthani, Nonthaburi, and Tak. Therefore, people are requested to follow the preventive measures especially wearing a mask, washing hands frequently, reducing unnecessary travel, avoiding crowded, high-risk places, scanning the Thai Chana application or using the Mor Chana app, monitoring the situation closely, observing symptoms for 14 days after visiting places that had a confirmed infected case. If you have a fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose, or you have difficulty with your sense of smell or taste, please see a doctor immediately and disclose your travel history as much as possible to reduce the spread of disease in the community and prevent the spread of infection to people at risk of severe illness or death.
