### 3. Thailand Implementations

- Samut Sakhon Province Officials had provided the COVID-19 vaccination for the target people, starting in three villages of the Tha Sai sub-district, which was the maximum strictly control area. The vaccination was administered to the registered people both with Samut Sakhon Hospital and Ta Sai Sub-district Administrative Organization. There had had no vaccine adverse reactions so far. However, those who have received the vaccination must observe their symptoms and answer a questionnaire from the line "MorPromp" application. For those who were unable to use the application, the responsible staff will call to inquire about the adverse reactions according to the same specified period as the application.
- The Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) Governor revealed that the BMA Health Bureau, together with the Institute of Urban Disease Prevention and Control (IUDC), plan to conduct an active case finding of COVID 19 in 694 communities, adjacent to Pathum Thani and Samut Sakhon provinces, with a total of 17,422 people. The target areas were composed of 410 communities of 5 districts adjacent to Pathum Thani province, namely Don Mueang, Sai Mai, Lak Si, Bang Khen and

Khlong Sam Wa, and 284 communities of 6 districts adjacent to Samut Sakhon province, namely Nong Khaem, Bang Khun Thian, Bang Khae, Jomthong, Bang Bon and Phasi Charoen.

- Regarding the first phase of COVID 19 vaccination service in Bangkok, the target people for vaccination were divided into three groups as follows: **Group 1** - All targeted health care providers had received the vaccination, **Group 2** - 2,840 other workers who had a risk of contacting COVID-19 patients such as village health volunteers, policemen, soldiers, and related personnel, 477 people (16.80%) had been vaccinated, and **Group 3** - 26,832 at-risk people will be vaccinated from 15 March 2021 onwards.

#### 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

The Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) had already deployed 116,520 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine to the first 13 target provinces and started the vaccination from 28 February 2021 onward. From the service monitoring, it was found that there were 40,140 people vaccinated as of 12 March 2021 of which no severe adverse events following vaccination were reported under close supervision of experts. Therefore, those in the target groups are advised to receive the vaccine at the specified service units in order to build up their immunity quickly.
