#### 3. Thailand Implementations

The Minister of the Ministry of Culture said that the Cabinet meeting approved a guideline for organizing activities for the year 2021 Songkran Festival under the theme "Songkran, a new way, Inherit Thai culture" to prevent the spread of COVID-19 infection. The activities will be organized as cultural heritage events including sprinkling scented water on the Buddha, offerings in a monk's alms bowl, entering a temple to listen to a sermon, pouring scented water on the hands of revered elders and blessing. Inviting to dress in polite clothes by using Thai or local fabrics. Activities involving large groups of people and close contact will be refrained and splashing water, abstaining from flaking and playing foam parties are not allowed as well.

The Department of Health Service Support under the Ministry of Public Health integrated the implementation with the project " all every Thai family has 3 their own doctors". The first doctor is the village health volunteers who will knock on the door of every house to provide the knowledge on COVID-19 vaccine. The main targeted group was changed from only the elderly who always stay in bed/ at home to the elderly aged more than 60 years and a group

of people with seven main underlying diseases. The village health volunteers will be well equipped with the knowledge on disease prevention and control including the vaccine.

#### 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the delivery of COVID-19 vaccination in healthcare workers, public health volunteers, frontline officers who contact patients, people with underlying diseases between February 28 and March 30, 2021, 151,413 people received the first dose of vaccination and 29,064 people have been completed the second dose of COVID-19 vaccine in 13 provinces including Chiang Mai, Tal (Mae Sot district), Nonthaburi, Pathum Thani, Samut Sakhon, Samut Songkram, Ratchaburi, Nakhon Pathom, Samut Pakarn, Chonburi, Phuket, Suratthani (Koh Samui district), and Bangkok. Nevertheless, it is inadequate to raise herd immunity. Therefore, residents in the mentioned provinces and vaccinated people are still at risk of infection during a waiting period for the second dose and for the period of the stimulation of the immune system. People who received the vaccine and the residents must strictly practice the self-protection measures (D-M-H-T-T) by keeping space at least 1-2 meters away from others or limiting the number of people in the areas, wearing a face mask/cloth mask at all time, frequently washing hands after touching objects that may be contaminated, such as elevators, knobs, handrails, etc. Body temperature checks before entering any places, testing for COVID-19 infection if signs and symptoms are suspected with contact history. Lastly, Using "Thai-Cha-Na"/ "Mor-Cha-Na" mobile apps while checking in and out.
