### 3. Thailand Implementations

The spokesperson for the Office of the Prime Minister said that the Center for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) made a resolution to extend the application "Pao Tang" via "Health Wallet" to increase the welfare benefit by allowing people to register for the COVID-19 vaccine. The Ministry of Finance and Krung Thai Bank (KTB) have been assigned to operate on this issue.

A spokesperson for the Prime Minister's Office said that the government has already distributed 800,000 doses of Sinovac vaccines to the target group including health care officers, frontline workers and a population at risk in 22 provinces across the country. The outbreak control areas, areas for tourism economy, border areas for economic recovery have been distributed 640,000 doses of vaccines and the other 160,000 doses will be distributed to target groups including village health volunteers in other areas,

## 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the COVID-19 situation among travelers entering Thailand and being quarantined in designated areas prepared by the government between March 29 and April 3, 2021, there were 81 confirmed cases and the average age was 38 years old. Of those 55 cases (67.9%) were Thai. Most of them were asymptomatic cases (63 cases or 77.8%). Countries of origin were found from Madagascar (10 cases or 12.3%), followed by the United States (8 cases or 9.9%), India (7 cases or 8.6%), and Malaysia (5 cases or 6.2%) that were related to the situation in each country. Therefore, screening procedure, surveillance, and quarantine among travelers from abroad must strictly implement even though the travellers come from low-risk countries. It is possible that those may not exhibit signs and symptoms at the initial phase of infection. The travelers must emphasize themselves to strictly practice their self-protection measures by wearing a face mask/cloth mask at all times even in their quarantine rooms. Frequently washing hands after touching objects that may be contaminated, such as doorknobs, handrails, etc. Lastly, do not leave the room though the laboratory results had not been detected.
