3. Thailand Implementations

- The Ministry of Public Health cooperated with the Ministry of Education in preparing for the starting of the new semester by 1. Having schools prepared for the new semester in 6 dimensions, 2. Assessed schools' readiness as according to the criteria of 44 items listed in the Thai Stop COVID list, 3. Having teachers, students, as well as their guardians, performed self-assessment in Thai Save Thai platform daily before going to school, 4. Enhance the safety using 6 plus multiplied 6 DMHT-RC main measures, SSET-CQ Supplemental Measures, and specific measures in the case of student transportation, and 5. Perform the joint supervision, monitoring, and evaluation by the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Public Health and have the schools report via MOE (COVID-19) system.
- The Department of Health requested for the cooperation from large factories to complete the self-assessment on Thai Stop COVID Plus platform, aiming for 3,300 factories with 200 workers or more to participate in the assessment by 15 June 2021 by having the Ministry of Industry being the main host together with 4 relevant agencies, namely: 1. Ministry of Labor, 2. Ministry of Interior, 3. The Office of the Board of Investment, and 4. Ministry of Public Health.
- Bangkok: The Prime Minister announced relaxation measures to help driving the economy since the epidemic situation is at a controllable level. There are 5 types of places that are relaxed consisting of 1. Museums and historical sites 2. Parks and botanical gardens. 3. Beauty clinics 4. massage parlor (Only foot massage is allowed) 5. Nail salons and tattoo shops. This will be effective from 14 June 2021 onwards.
- Surat Thani province announced the relaxation measures. For those arriving from the maximum control areas and the maximum and strict control zones, when entering the area, they must scan the QR Code "SAVE SURAT" and report to the local communicable disease control officer within 24 hours, as well as quarantine for 14 days, except those who have certified real-time PCR detection within 72 hours or the person who has been fully vaccinated.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

According to the COVID-19 situation monitoring on 13 June 2021, in Thailand, there were 195,909 accumulated infected cases with 2,804 new cases. The daily number of cases from local transmission was relatively stable. The number of infected people with a history of risk traveling has declined, however, the number of cases from occupational infections has been increasing including workers in factories, construction camps, merchants in markets and shopping malls as well as those general workers who have to meet a lot of people such as drivers of public transportation and cargo trucks, and security guards, etc. This indicates the continuous disease spreading in the workplace and among the public service workers. Regarding the measures to prevent the outbreaks in the establishments, the "Bubble and Seal" measure should be implemented to reduce the risk of disease spreading into the communities as well as to expedite the screening of infected people in the worker group for disease isolation and bring them to the treatment system as soon as possible. It should plan



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for COVID-19 vaccination in the population at risk of severe illness and general people in the areas where the outbreak has been found for building herd immunity in the community. In addition, people should reduce risk behaviors for infection such as refrain from group talking or eating together. If people need to contact each other, such as working or taking public transport, they need to comply with preventive measures intensively to prevent disease spreading. All offices must have a screening system of any fever or respiratory symptoms of the staff before entering the place. Staff are also required to report the employer, especially those suspected of being in high-risk contact with the confirmed COVID-19 patients without waiting for symptoms to appear.
