3. Thailand Implementations

- Kanchanaburi suspends the use of channels for import-export of all types of goods across the border at the trade relief point at the Three Pagodas Checkpoint (Temporary border crossing point for tourism) in Nong Lu, Sangkhlaburi including all natural channels through the border From 14 - 27 June 2021.
- The Department of Medical Services, Ministry of Public Health reported on the situation of beds in Bangkok Metropolitan which have a total of 30,211 beds. 10,820 beds are vacant. There are 1,146 beds for critically ill patients (red); occupied 984 beds and vacant 162 beds. There are 10,986 beds for moderately ill patients (Yellow): available 2,999 beds. There are a total of 18,079 beds for asymptomatic patients (green) in field hospitals and hospitels, both public and private. 10,420 are occupied and 7,659 beds are vacant accounting for 64.2% of a total vacant bed.
- Bangkok agreed to relax measures for service opening as follows;
 - 1. Museum, local museum or other type of museum and historical site.
 - 2. Public park and botanical garden are allowed opening for walking and running
 - 3. Aesthetic medicine clinic
 - 4. Health establishments (spa and massage services are allowed to open for foot massage)
 - 5. People who use service at the nail salons and tattoo shops must wear a mask at all times and do not touch on the face.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

According to the global COVID-19 situation monitoring, more than 175 million accumulated cases were found. The number of daily cases has a decreased trend with 5 hundred thousand a day. There are still high outbreak rates in India and South America. The situation of COVID-19 spreading in Thailand found that 170,401 cumulative cases have been reported in the new wave. The number of daily infections in the country tends to stabilize at around two thousand cases per day. Today (15 June 2021), there are 2,561 new infection cases from 50 provinces and 784 new cases have been found in prisons or detention centers. The trend of infection has decreased in the North and Northeast regions, but there are still a cluster of new outbreaks in the central and southern regions. Especially in Bangkok and its vicinity that continues to have an increasing trend in the outbreak. The number of cases from occupational infections has been increasing including workers in factories, establishments and construction camps. There were 1,372 deaths from this wave of outbreaks with a case-fatality rate of 0.68 percent. According to the COVID-19 vaccination database, more than 6.1 million doses of the vaccine have been injected. In addition, it is essential that people should refrain from organizing group activities and strictly adhere to preventive measures such as wearing a mask or cloth mask every time you leave the house, washing your hands often, keeping distance and working from home, avoiding going into crowded places, avoiding



eating food in public areas and eating together to reduce the spreading of the disease.
