3. Thailand Implementations

- The Ministry of Public Health (MOPH) has announced the closure of the Budsarakam Field Hospital after its 130 days of operation. This is due to the implemented prevention and control measures that have resulted in a continuously decreasing trend of daily new COVID-19 confirmed cases. During the past 1 2 weeks of September 2021, the cases at the hospital have dramatically decreased to approximately 5 cases per day while other patients have fully recovered and discharged from the hospital. Therefore, all supplies and equipment will be moved out starting September 20, 2021. The mission is scheduled to be completed on September 30. The area will be returned to the Impact Arena on October 1, 2021.
- The National Communicable Disease Committee has given approval to the Center for COVID-19 Situation Administration (CCSA) to reduce the quarantine period for travelers from abroad in the pilot tourism areas. The committee has also acknowledged the COVID-19 vaccination plan to achieve its target during October and December 2021.
- Loei Province has announced the opening of Phu Kradueng National Park on October 1, 2021 in the form of COVID Free Setting. Tourists must have a complete vaccination as scheduled or take the RT-PCR or ATK tests for no more than 3 days and strictly follow the COVID-19 preventive measures according to the Ministry of Public Health.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

According to the COVID-19 situation monitoring, as of September 24, 2021, Thailand has had 1,537,310 cumulated confirmed cases. Today there are 12,697 new cases with 132 deaths of whom most are at-risk groups of severe illness. Therefore, these groups of people are encouraged to receive vaccination service as soon as possible when it becomes available. Responsible officers are assigned to closely monitor the infection situation. In addition, the public are advised to maintain strict disease prevention measures such as wearing masks, washing hands, keeping physical distance from others and avoiding unnecessary travel, especially to high-risk areas.
