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3. Thailand Implementations

- The Ministry of Transport has randomly checked the COVID-19 prevention measures at the pier in Ban Phe Subdistrict area, Koh Samet, Rayong Province, in preparation to receive tourists according to the government's preparations to relax the lockdown measures. From the past 3 months records, there have been more than 15,476 tourists using the pier with an average of over 5,000 tourists per month.
- The Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) has organized a free of charge One-Stop-Service on COVID-19 testing active activity. The service's targets include motorcycle taxi drivers, taxi drivers, food delivery riders, private company bus drivers and local people in Sai Mai community area. Infected people found will be immediately sent to 4 hospitals for free of charge treatment. The service aims to accelerate separation of infected people from the communities and bring them into the treatment process as soon as possible.
- The Ministry of Public Health has aimed to provide the complete 2 doses of COVID-19 vaccines within this year (2021). It has planned to cover 30 million people (45% of the population) by October and 42 million people (60% of the population) by November, and 52 million people (74% of the population) by December. In addition, the third booster dose will also be planned accordingly. This will help Thailand to be one of the COVID-19 safe countries in the world.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

According to the COVID-19 situation monitoring, as of September 26, 2021, Thailand has had 1,561,638 cumulated confirmed cases. Today, there are 12,353 new cases with 125 deaths of whom most are at-risk groups of severe illness or even death. Therefore, the Ministry of Public Health has given priority on immunization of these groups of people as soon as possible. The at-risk groups include the elderly aged 60 years and over, people with the 7 underlying chronic diseases, and the 12 weeks and over pregnant women. In addition, the public are advised to maintain strict disease prevention measures such as wearing masks, washing hands, keeping physical distance from others and avoiding unnecessary travel, especially to high-risk areas.
