#### 3. Thailand Implementations

- The Ministry of Public Health has reminded people in the provinces in the dark red areas to avoid gatherings of more than 50 people due to the risk of spreading the coronavirus disease 2019. It is necessary to implement strict prevention measures such as wearing masks at all times, keeping your distance and washing your hands with alcohol every time you come in contact with objects.
- Nakhon Si Thammarat Province announced to close 10 communities in the municipality of Nakhon Si Thammarat, to investigate and control the disease from

spreading outside the area, as well as request for people's cooperation to protect themselves to the highest level, follow the strict measures and avoid traveling to epidemic areas. The province also prepared to open a field hospital including an additional 200 bed waiting center for people to receive thorough care and treatment.

• The Prime Minister's Office has instructed all agencies to adjust their work plans in accordance with the balancing act under the situation of COVID 19 and urgently help people affected by floods in all areas by adjusting the work plan to help people and reducing the work from home from 95 percent to 90 percent during the first 2 weeks of October 2021 and adjusted to 85 percent and must check ATK every 3 days.

#### 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the COVID-19 situation surveillance during 23 September – 3 October 2021, a total of 75,794 cases were found, of which 75,702 cases infected domestically, 36,169 cases (47.8%) infected with the virus through contacting with infected people within the community, 6,209 cases (8.2%) found from the screening and proactive surveillance in the community, and 57% of these cases are not showing any symptoms. The first 5 provinces with highest new cases are Bangkok with 10,469 cases (13.8%), Samut Prakan 5,036 cases (6.7%), Chonburi 4,897 cases (6.5%), Yala 3,817 cases (5.0%) and Narathiwat 3,231 cases (4.3%). In these 5 provinces, the most risk of infection was close contact with the 11,822 previously confirmed cases who are family members and people at the workplace. Even though the trend of new infection in many provinces has reduced and public health relax measures have been implemented, the provinces still have a risk of spreading within factories, establishments or companies with a high number of employees. Therefore, people gathering should be reduced in the workplaces. The prevention of spreading in factories, establishments or companies should be emphasized and people should comply with the preventive measures intensively such as refrain from eating together, set up a rule of wearing a mask all the time in the workplaces, often wash hands as well as prepare hand sanitizer at various risk points such as lift, handrail and door knob.
