3. Thailand Implementations

- The Department of Health, Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) has launched the mix-and-match COVID-19 vaccination registration through LINE Official Account (LINE OA) for Thais, aged 18 years old and over, residing in Bangkok, who have not received any vaccination. The scheme will provide the Sinovac for the first shot and the AstraZeneca for the second shot. The service will be closed when the allocated vaccines have been fully registered by eligible people.
- The Zuellig Pharma Company has announced the progress that the delivery of 560,000 doses of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine delivery will be completed by November 5, 2021. The company has prepared all supports for the vaccine transportation and distribution. It has also confirmed that it will deliver 1.9 million doses of the vaccine to Thailand within the fourth quarter of 2021.
- Chiang Mai Province, Nakorn-ping Hospital and the Sub-district Administrative Organization have prepared to establish the second Community Isolation Center in Muang District. The center with 400 beds accommodation will be managed by Nakorn-ping Hospital. Currently, the management system, including preparation of

medical supplies and equipment and the readiness of the personnel and safety standards for the patients and communities, are being tested.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

According to the situation monitoring of COVID-19, as of October 25, 2021, Thailand has 1,859,157 accumulated confirmed cases. There are 8,675 new confirmed cases with 44 deaths today which is the lowest number in the past 100 days. Although the overall situation of the country has tended to improve, there are still some provinces where the number of daily cases continues to increase especially in the southern region and most of the cases have been related to community-infection, the participation in group activities as well family contact. Many clusters of cases had been found in other provinces which are related to community activities in places such as markets, funerals. In addition, most of the deaths remained in the at-risk of severe illness groups including the elderly or people with underlying diseases. The Ministry of Public Health has given priority to the immunization of these groups as soon as possible, including the elderly aged 60 years and over, people with 7 underlying diseases, and pregnant women of 12 weeks and over, to reduce severe illness or death. However, strict adherence to the disease prevention measures is still important in reducing the spread of the disease. Therefore, the public is advised to strictly protect themselves by wearing masks, keeping distance, washing hands, and reducing travel to risk areas.
