3. Thailand Implementations

- The Royal Thai Army Commander visited the Western border area between Thailand and Myanmar at Suan Phueng District, Ratchaburi which is the area responsible of the Surasi Forces to monitor border defense missions and intercept illegal things,in particular, illegal immigrant migrant workers who have not passed the COVID-19 screening as part of the preparation for the opening of the country on November 1, 2021.
- Chinat Provincial Emergency Incident Commander has issued an order to close and prohibit anyone from entering and leaving Sukjai Community area, Nai Mueang Subdistrict, Muang District Chainat Province from 27 October to 1 November 2021 or until the order will change. Those who needed to travel must obtain permission from

the Communicable Disease Control Officer according to Communicable Disease Act, B.E. 2558 (2015).

• The Ministry of Foreign Affairs in collaboration with the Digital Government Development Agency created a platform called "Thailand Pass" for obtaining an electronic travel certificate (Thailand Pass QR Code) to make it more convenient and reduce unnecessary procedures for travelers. This will begin on November 1, 2021 at 9:00 am onwards. The goal is to facilitate traveling under the concept of "Ease of Traveling" after re-opening the country and to reduce the process of filling and uploading documents, including filling out information through Tor. 8 (health survey) and TM. 6 (Entry form) in the Thailand Pass before entering Thailand.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the COVID-19 situation monitoring, as of October 28, 2021, Thailand has 1,884,973 cumulative confirmed cases, of which 9,658 new cases have been confirmed the day, with 84 deaths. For COVID-19 vaccination coverage, more than 57.09% of people in Thailand received one dose of vaccine and 40.86% received at least two doses. Currently, the rate of vaccination in Thailand is more than 700,000 people per day. This is considered a significantly higher rate of new vaccinations and the coverage of the second dose of COVID-19 vaccination results in the reduction of new infected cases. However, there are some provinces with low vaccination rates. Therefore, vaccination should be accelerated. In addition, the Ministry of Public Health has given priority to the immunization of people as soon as possible, especially in the tourism pilot areas. It needs to raise the level of people's immunity to prevent the disease. The preventive measures are still important to reduce the spreading of the disease. So, people are requested to wear a mask, keep social distance and wash hands.
