3. Thailand Implementations

- The Center for COVID-19 Situation Administration resolved to reduce control area and prevent the spread of COVID-19 as well as to relax the lockdown measures for businesses and some activities, effective from November 1, 2021. Curfew will be lifted in four provinces that are pilot areas including Bangkok, Krabi, Phang Nga and Phuket and people can sit and drink alcoholic beverages in the shop based on specific measures in each area.
- Trang Province has postponed on-site school opening from November 1, 2021 and ordered the use of online learning platforms until the COVID-19 situation would improve. 85 percent of Teachers and students must receive vaccines. All Trang tourist islands require more than 90 percent of citizens to be vaccinated for annual

events within the province after the opening of the city. If the overall situation is not improving, all events will be canceled as well.

• Nakhon Ratchasima Province: Educational institutions in 32 districts have postponed the opening of on-site classes for health safety and to be careful to protect students, teachers, and educational personnel by managing classes online between 1 and 26 November 2021 instead. Classes may be adjusted according to the situation.

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From the COVID-19 situation monitoring, as of 30 October 2021, Thailand has 1,903,165 cumulative confirmed cases, of which 9,224 new cases have been confirmed on the day, with 88 deaths. The number of people infected with COVID-19 and those who died in the past week is still relatively stable, on average, there are 9,000 infections per day and 80 deaths per day, with most of the deaths being at high-risk groups. However, this stable situation does not imply that the trend of infected people continues to decline, and after the disease control and prevention measures were lifted, the number of infections and deaths could increase. The Ministry of Public Health has given importance to Immunization for the population in the country, especially in the tourism pilot area that will be opened on 1 November 2021, which is necessary to raise the immunity of the population to a high enough level to control the disease. However, strictly complying with disease control measures, for example, wearing a mask, keeping distance, washing hands, and having a test, is still important in order to reduce spread of the disease.
