3. Thailand Implementations

- The CCSA announced it would amend disease prevention and control measures as well as zoning. The maximum controlled area and the strict (dark red) area of 7 provinces were adjusted to 6 provinces, including Tak, Nakhon Si Thammarat, Narathiwat, Pattani, Yala and Songkhla.
- Chiang Mai Province announced that 15 areas in the municipality of Chiang Mai will be the highest control area. The implementation of active case finding in each community is accompanied by a special vaccination center which will initially be launched in the Chang Khan sub-district.
- Between 11 and 24 November 2021, Nan Province announced the closure of Baan Song Khwae Moo.5 and Baan Mai Charoensuk, Sanian Subdistrict, Mueang Nan Moo 14. The control measures aim to prevent COVID-19 in areas affected by the

outbreak by using the Antigen Test Kit (ATK), a self-declaration set point to inform the schedule of outsiders in the village. However, schools and childcare centers have to stop teaching for 14 days .

4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

According to the information of the Global COVID -19 situation, it found more than 253 million cumulative confirmed cases (more than 400,000 cases per day) and there was an increasing trend of new cases when compared to the number of mid - October due to the high number of cases in Europe. The majority of cases were reported from Germany, the United States, the United Kingdom, and Russia. For the situation in ASEAN, the overall number of cases showed a decreasing trend. However, the outbreak remains high in Vietnam at more than 8,000 cases per day and there was no sign of decreasing its number.

Thailand had 1,982,468 cumulative confirmed cases, of which 7,057 new cases have been confirmed today. There was a decreasing trend of COVID -19 cases in every part of Thailand (around 7,000 cases per day). While new confirmed cases were mostly found in the center and south of the country, particularly in Bangkok, Samut Prakan, Chonburi, Samut Sakorn and Nonthaburi. The total number of deaths was 19,895 cases (1.00%). The cases were mostly found in the elderly and people with underlying diseases who had no history of receiving the vaccine or were not fully vaccinated. For the vaccination rollout situation in Thailand, more than 84 million doses were inoculated among people with more than 36.2 million people who received 2 doses of vaccines. The provinces with the highest proportion of persons receiving two or more doses of vaccine were Bangkok, Phuket, and Chonburi. Most provinces still accounted for less than 50 percent of vaccinated people. Even though the rate of people received the vaccine was significantly increasing, the country is still at risk for the COVID -19 due to the reopening country policy and relaxing measures as well as the vaccine provided can prevent the severe symptom and death from the COVID -19, not prevent the transmission of its disease. In the meantime, it was expected that the number of new cases will decrease gradually this week at more than 6,000 cases per day), therefore, there was a need to make a surveillance among patients with suspected symptoms, actively investigate the cluster outbreak in risk areas, and encourage people to lift their guide high by wearing a mask, always washing hands, implementing the work from home policy as appropriate, refraining from visiting the risk areas or mass gathering places and getting the vaccine.
