### 3. Thailand Implementations

- Ministry of Public Health urged all provinces to conduct an opinion survey of people who refuse to be vaccinated against COVID-19 in order to adjust vaccination strategies to meet the 100 million dose target and move forward to safely open a country. The situation is generally stable, with fewer serious illnesses, but still needs to be constantly monitored for various clusters and risk groups.
- Geo-Informatics and Space Technology Development Agency (Public Organization) together with the National Research Council of Thailand have developed iMap Platform piloting in Chiang Mai and 4 other provinces to link information on COVID-19 management by using Geoinformatics data from satellite systems to effectively control the disease.
- The Tourism Authority of Thailand announced to invite tour operators access to COVID-19 screening services with the Antigen Test Kit (ATK) for free in 2 locations in Bangkok at Huamark Stadium and Royal Rattanakosin Hotel from November 25, 2021 to January 24, 2022 at 08.00 a.m. -12.00 p.m. If the infection is detected, the

infected case will be transferred for a comprehensive treatment system without expenses.

#### 4. Risk Assessment of COVID-19 Situation

From COVID-19 situation monitoring, on November 23, 2021, Thailand has 2,076,135 cumulative confirmed cases, of which 5,126 new cases have been confirmed on the day, and 53 deaths, most of which are from the High-risk groups who, when infected, are prone to become severely ill or die. In this regard, the Ministry of Public Health has given priority to the immunization of the population in the country as soon as possible, especially in tourism areas, which need to raise the immunity of the population to a high level, areas with high rates of new confirmed cases, and in the risk groups with the possibility of severe illness or death include the elderly aged 60 years and over, those with 7 chronic diseases, and pregnant women with gestational age of 12 weeks or more. Also, strictly comply to disease prevention measures, for example, wearing mask, keeping distance, and washing hand frequently is still important to reduce the spread of the disease.
